Boston A new edition of the journals of Josiah Quincy, a former mayor of Boston and a member of the Class of 1821 of Harvard College, with an introduction and footnotes by M. A. DeWolfe Howe, whose access to unpublished Quincy papers and photographs has enabled him to materially enhance the interest of the former collection. The journals in themselves are delightful; the author writes with a charming simplicity, recording wittily and vividly his recollections of Lafayette, of the Harvard of a hundred years ago, and of John Adams, John Randolph, Andrew Jackson and many others. An interesting and valuable book. It is competently annotated and indexed.

A SENTIMENTAL JOURNEY, LETTERS TOELIZA, And Other Pieces.
