Mussolini perpetrated this novel as a serial for a newspaper when he was twenty-six and living in Trient. It relates the tragedy of a great cardinal prince who endeavors to persuade the Pope to release him from his vows and allow him to marry the ravishing Claudia, for whom he has cherished a life-long passion. The Pope refuses, thus giving the young author an opportunity to expound his violent anticlericalism. There follows intrigue after intrigue, until one of Claudia's enemies succeeds in killing her, leaving the cardinal to an inconsolable old age. A trashy tale. Hiram Motherwell has made the indifferent translation.
