BIOGRAPHY

★★★ A VERMONT BOYHOOD, by Thomas Emerson Ripley. \$1.50. *Appleton-Century*. Nostalgic reminiscences of nineteenth-century Vermont, charmingly written. In those halcyon days, as Mr. Ripley remembers them, folk made up with a sense of humor and a sense of human values what they lacked in plumbing and Progress.

★★★ LORD BOTHWELL AND MARY QUEEN OF SCOTS, by Robert Gore-Browne. \$4.00. *Doubleday, Doran*. Rehabilitation of the great Scots gentleman whose weakness, insists Mr. Robert Gore-Browne, was loyalty; and whose sin was patriotism. Further, the consolation of widowed queens was the hereditary aptitude of the Hepburns. Mary the Queen, it seems, was just another French girl lost in a fog. A fine and readable biography.

★★★ A SAGA OF THE SEAS, by Philip B. McDonald. \$3.00. *Wilson-Erickson*. The public hooted when Cyrus W. Field proposed laying the first Atlantic cable. But the scoffers lived to see the day when they paid cash to send messages by submarine telegraph. This biography of an American pioneer is of historical value: ably written, documented, and indexed.

★★★ RED CLOUD'S FOLK, by George E. Hyde. \$3.50. *University of Oklahoma Press*. The historians come off second best in this reappraisal of Indian warfare in the West. The Oglala Sioux are under consideration, and we discover that Red Cloud was both a warrior and a statesman. Mr. Hyde's efforts to portray the Indian as a human being

ing—rather than as a saint or a devil—are as successful as they are refreshing.

★★★ RECOLLECTIONS AND REFLECTIONS, by Sir J. J. Thomson. \$4.00. *Macmillan*. One of the world's most esteemed scientists recounts the happenings of a lifetime in a busy, traveled world. Sir Joseph understands how to employ humor and anecdote in lightening the record of technical research.

★★★ MARCONI: THE MAN AND HIS WIRELESS, by Orrin E. Dunlap, Jr. \$3.50. *Macmillan*. Life and exploits of the late Italian who found miracles in other men's theories; and who was not afraid of scientists' ridicule; and who confounded the pundits by proving that radio and television were practical necessities in a modern world. Mr. Dunlap, radio editor of the *New York Times*, writes ably, in layman's terms.

★★★ THE LIFE OF EARL JELlicoe, by Admiral Sir Reginald Bacon. \$5.00. *Cassell & Company*: Toronto. A full-length, comprehensive portrait of the late British seaman, to whom fell the task of saving an Empire—from a quarterdeck. Sir Reginald, being the official biographer, writes favorably; but it is doubtful if he could do other. Jellicoe's critics were united on but one point: that he was able. Which would seem to be an all-important characteristic in a man selected to command the world's largest battle fleet.

★★★ HART CRANE, by Philip Horton. \$3.00. *Norton*. A penetrating portrait of an American poet, in which the biographer (Continued on back advertisement, p. x)
