In those halcyon days, as Mr. Ripley remembers them, folk made up with a sense of humor and a sense of human values what they lacked in plumbing and Progress.

\*\*\* LORD BOTHWELL AND MARY QUEEN OF SCOTS, by Robert Gore-Browne. \$4.00. Doubleday, Doran. Rehabilitation of the great Scots gentleman whose weakness, insists Mr. Robert Gore-Browne, was loyalty; and whose sin was patriotism. Further, the consolation of widowed queens was the hereditary aptitude of the Hepburns. Mary the Queen, it seems, was just another French girl lost in a fog. A fine and readable biography.
