

Mozart — Symphony No. 38, in D, 'Pragu K 504 (Columbia Album M-410, \$3.50). The rich strings of the Chicago Symphony O chestra and the values of contemporary r cording make this enthusiastic reading ! Frederick Stock preferable, on the whole, two other well performed editions.
