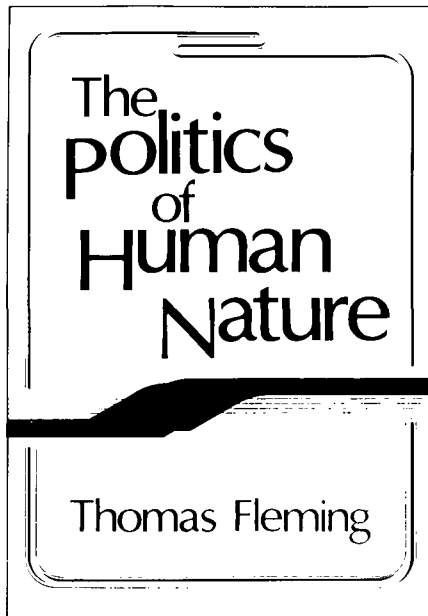

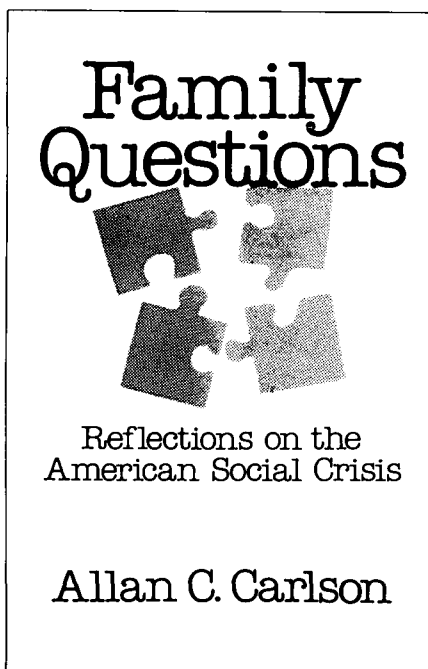
THE POLITICS OF HUMAN NATURE

The effort to understand human nature in a political context is a daunting challenge that has been undertaken in a variety of ways and by a myriad of disciplines through the ages. This volume takes up a variety of specific issues: sex and gender differences, democracy and dictatorship, individual and familial patterns of association. The author shows how forms of legitimate authority, such as families, communities, and nations establish such authority by appeals to human nature, and that these appeals, while presumably resting on empirical evidence, also confirm the existence of normative structures. Fleming's work is an effort of synthesis that is sure to arouse discussion and debate.
