"The Rise of Rome"



Drawing on readings from Livy, Plautus, Terence, Cato, and Plutarch, students will discover why the Founding Fathers of the American Republic chose the Roman Republic as their model. Lectures will include discussions of Rome's influence on the Anglo-American republican tradition; classical architecture and its legacy; the army that stopped Hannibal; the Roman family; and Cato the Elder and the crisis of the Roman Republic.

Daily guided walks will introduce students to the Eternal City's great churches, museums, and archeological sites. Special events include an excursion to Ostia Antica and a lunch at Cipriani.
