The aim of this text-book is to present, in as concrete a form as is possible, the rudiments of Logic, considered as method. Exercises are supplied for most of the chapters: emphasis is put upon the application of the principles discussed.

At many points, too, Prof. Jones brings his chapters into touch with practical problems of the day in a way that can hardly fail to stimulate even the dull.
