

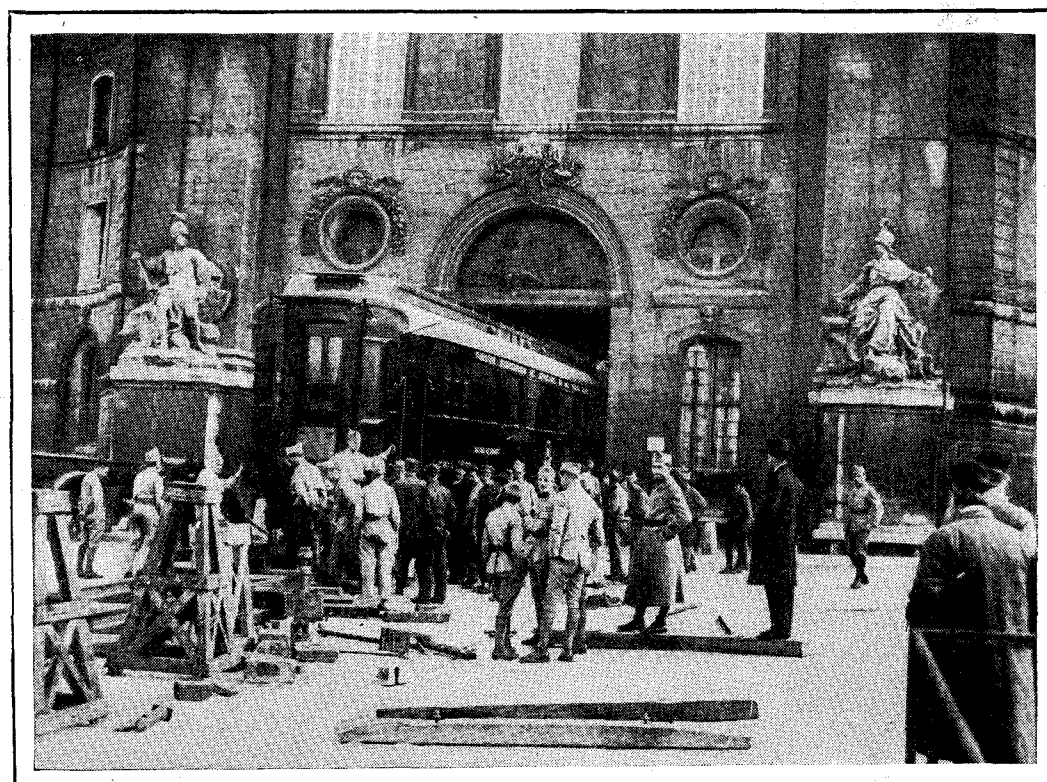
THE CENTENARY OF NAPOLEON'S DEATH

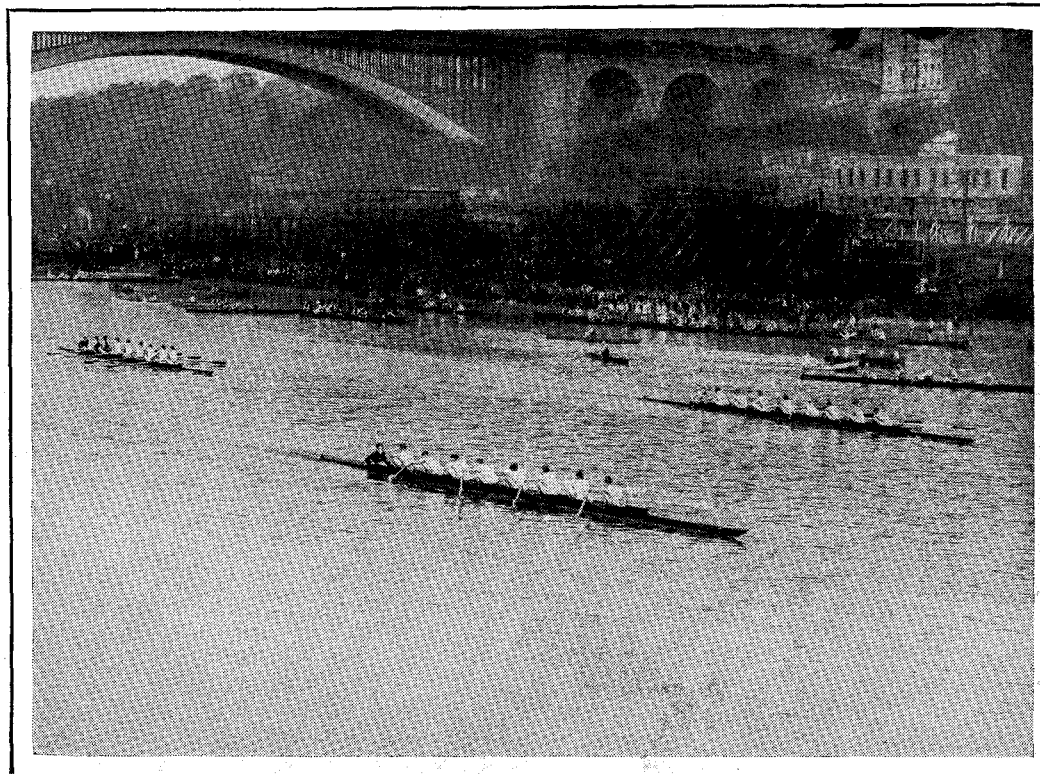


THE HISTORIC

BOAT RACING AND BASEBALL



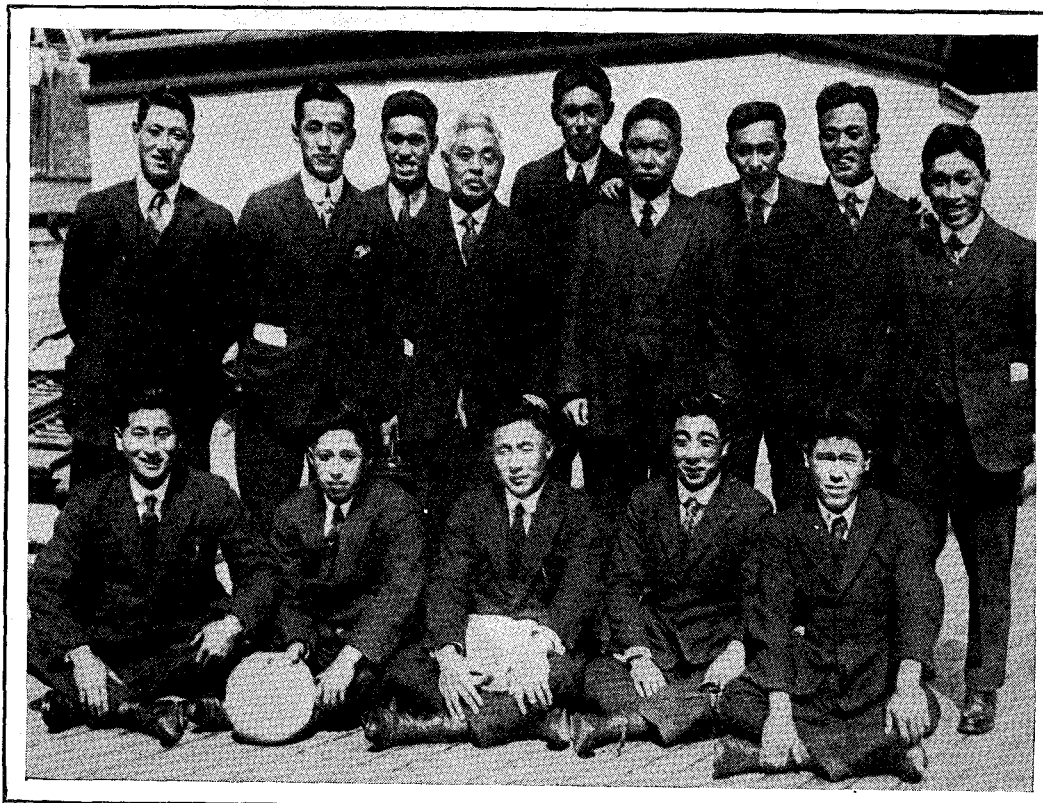
COLUMBIA CREW WINS THE CHILDS CUP ON THE HARLEM RIVER
