

General Wood, it is reported, is investigating conditions not only in the cities but in the smaller towns and villages of the Philippine Islands, in preparation for a report to President Harding



#### REBUILDING YPRES

Here we see the ruins of the historic Cloth Hall at Ypres, destroyed by the Germans early during the war. The actual work of rebuilding, as indicated by the scaffolding, has begun, and the Cloth Hall will be restored so far as possible. On the ruins a placard reads: "Notice. This is holy ground. No stone of this fabric may be taken away. It is a heritage for all civilized peoples. By order, Town Mayor." The fact that the sign is in the English language may have some significance in its relation to American and English tourists
