The Market Process Center

The Market Process Center is dedicated to developing Austrian economics and applying it to concrete problems of social life. Center faculty and graduate students undertake "close-up" empirical investigations that are guided by theories of social learning found in the work of Carl Menger, Ludwig von Mises, Friedrich Hayek, Ludwig Lachmann, and their contemporary followers.

Program on Social & Organizational Learning

The Program is an interdisciplinary department made up of faculty from economics, computer science, sociology, and other disciplines, who are studying the role of knowledge in society and in organizations.

The Program works closely with other George Mason University departments that offer graduate degrees, such as the Economics Department, The Institute of Public Policy, and the Master of Arts in Interdisciplinary Studies Program (MAIS). The University
