When you have guessed a word, fill it in on the dashes; then write each tetter numbered square on the puzzle diagram. When the squares are all filled in you will find (by reading from left to right) a quotation from a famous author. Reading up and down the letters mean nothing. The black squares indicate ends of words;
therefore words do not necessarily end at the right side of the diagram.
