

Chess Corner—No. 71

THE ADVENT of eighteen-year-old Bobby Fischer, the United States champion, on the international scene has made the first dent in the Soviet Union's monopoly on premier positions in the field of chess, a monopoly which they have enjoyed for the past two decades. With his victory over Mikhail Tahl, former world champion, at Bled, Yugoslavia, the boy became a man.

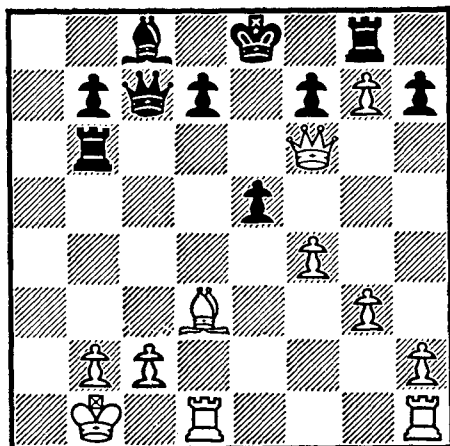
That Tahl took a few liberties in the development of his opening in this encounter is a matter of speculation. If he did, he will not do it again. In ten short moves, his game was theoretically wrapped up, even though it required precise play and a Queen sacrifice to prove the point. Here is the game.

ing Nikita Garanine, the sixth grader chosen by the Russians, led to an interest in Alyosha, his ninth-grade brother. This in turn led to a request by the Americans to film the boys at home, so as to show the connection between family and school. After due consideration, this further penetration was permitted, and in the several days' shooting at home, mutually friendly relations were established with the boys' family.

Toward the end of the extended time period, crew and cameras were permitted into both Moscow University and an Internat or Boarding School, the prototype of all future institutions of basic Communist education. Finally, the Russians agreed that the network might scrap, if it chose, the original premise of the show, which was to compare Soviet and American schools, and utilize its full Bell and Howell hour in the fall for a view of Soviet schools in Moscow.

The evidence permits an obvious inference—namely, that the Russians are the gainers in this new design, winning, as they do, a broader platform for the material they chose to show us. The enlargement of scope, creates, however, a stronger tension among the producers to counterbalance the Russian gain. Whatever the opposite pulls in this interesting encounter, the interpenetration of attitudes cannot help but be civilizing. The ABC team (which included Mike Campus, Russian-speaking researcher, and Dudley Plummer, English sound recordist) came with Western curiosity to inquire into Soviet education. The Russian teachers responded, in their turn, with many questions about American pedagogy. The Radio-TV Committee has, furthermore, invited the ABC crew to return and to travel throughout the Soviet Union to film other documentaries. Hopefully, the adventure will also bear fruit by way of a visit by a Soviet TV team to the U.S.

This was an exchange between one major American network and the Soviet government—something of a semiofficial innovation. Sooner or later other networks should follow. The zeal of Vladimir, the Russian photographer, for the galloping camera of the American Hartigan could well turn out to be a peaceful symbol and a hopeful portent. The wide-angle lens of television's cultural "aggression" operating at fundamental settings of human relationships, may contribute more to world peace than many a more formal diplomatic or political interaction.

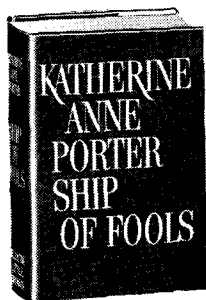

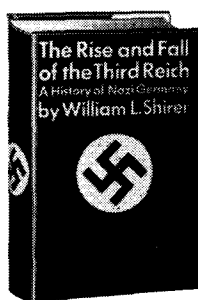

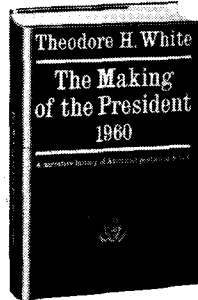
