

## Do Try to Live With The American Way of Death

I HAVE a suspicion that it is only the survivors who are complaining about the wasteful expenses of burial. America can well afford luxurious funerals, if only to prove it is the richest country in the world. But, paradoxically, poor people in poor countries are the most generous in spending on the dead. It is unthinkable among the poor to try to save money and thereby put a dent on the honor of the deceased.

In my poor old country (China), for example, funerals were as a rule more extravagant than weddings. When my grandfather died—long before the present pragmatism—his funeral was a fortynine-day affair, during which many mouths of mourning friends and relatives had to be fed. places, my grandfather's body remained in the house for five days before it was enclosed in the casket, Buddhist monks, nuns, and Taoist priests were hired each day to render prayer services, and mourners streamed in and out of the house to pay their last respects. Meals were provided by catering services and some relatives lodged with us until the fifth day, when my grandfather was sent off to the cemetery in a long procession of pageantry that included bands of Chinese and Western-style musicians. My father was a proud person; he wouldn't be subject to the gossip that he was niggardly in spending money on the last journey of my grandfather.

But that wasn't all. For the next seven weeks, on each consecutive seventh day, a memorial service was held, and monks, nuns, and priests were hired for the occasion. Again, people from near and far came and mouths had to be fed. When on the forty-ninth day the altar was finally removed, my father, if not in debt, had exhausted most of his savings and what little inheritance my grandfather had left him.

Times change. Years later my grandmother's funeral was not nearly as elaborate-a result of the war. Then, a few years ago, my mother's funeral, I was told, had come down to the barest possible necessity under the Red regimethough she did have a coffin of fine quality, which she had had custommade long before she had approached old age.

I personally care little about the high cost of dying. It's the high cost of living that's getting me now.



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# Chess Corner—No. 96

THE King's Fianchetto Defense is 1 . . . P-KN3 in reply to any White move. In the recent tournament at Zagreb, Yugoslavia, the Danish grand master, Bent Larsen, one of the candidates for the role of challenger to the world title, essayed this defense against the American grand master Arthur Bisguier and thereby reaped the whirlwind.

In classical style, Bisguier establishes a strong central pawn front, and with 9 P-B5 initiates a withering assault.

With 11 . . . PxP, Black wins a Pawn. But this is his last solace before suffering a painful intrusion. Note that 12... BxB 13 QxB, followed by N-N5, establishes a White mating net.


Black's comparative blunder is 12 . . . N/1-B3. Better is 12 . . . N/2-B3. After 13 N-N5, however, there is no plausible move for the defender; 13 . . . N-K4 is no worse than anything else.

If 14 . . . BxR 15 B-N7 wins. Likewise, if 14 . . . PxR 15 B-N7 wins. Black's chief problem before playing 14 . . . B-R1 is whether to resign. But he enjoys a rather forlorn hope. If White continues hastily with 15 B-N7, then . . . KxB 16 Q-R7ch, KxR, with a new life.

15 R-B1 accents the piece plus, and the crusher is 16 B-B8. If 16 . . . KxB 17 QxB mate. If 16 . . . RxB 17 Q-R7 mate.
