returned from Moscow with rude truths? And why, of all things, did this scientist stay with the Stalin who set up Lysenkoism as biological dogma? If this was individualism, it found odd expression when Haldane refused "to join in the fashionable chorus of anti-Stalinism."

Eventually he did leave the Party. And in 1957, at sixty-five, soon after the Anglo-French attack on Egypt, he left England too, with the parting suggestion that she heavily tax her prostitutes to help pay for that campaign. Accompanied by the geneticist who had become his second wife, he emigrated to India. There he resumed research, adopted Gandhi costume and ideals, loved the people and detested the bureaucracy.

Finally, at the age of seventy-one, came cancer of the rectum, followed by a colostomy. He celebrated the experience in his famed, partly bawdy doggerel poem "Cancer's a Funny Thing," which seemed impertinent levity to many and was praised by many others. JBS shrugged off the complaints: "Every poem should have a social function." Hence the closing lines: "A spot of laughter, I am sure, / Often accelerates one's cure; / So let us patients do our bit / To help the surgeons make us fit."

His cheer and new plans were premature. He learned too late that conventions had won—his doctors had withheld the truth. JBS died a year later, lamenting in his own way. "I don't mind dying. I mind dying with unkept promises."
