Raffles in Houston: Because We're All Guilty, Nobody Is Guilty

In a sense, a movie like *The Thief Who Came to Dinner*, which has a PG (parental guidance) rating, tells a good deal more about the moral state of the nation than such triple-X-rated skin flicks as *Deep Throat* or *Lunch*. Set in Houston and having to do with a blond, all-American computer engineer (Ryan O'Neal) who quits his job to become a Raffles-like jewel thief, *The Thief Who Came to Dinner* is based on a set of profoundly cynical assumptions about our society. Bud Yorkin, who produced and directed the film, and Walter Hill, who wrote it, start from a premise they clearly accept as undisputed fact: just about everyone in the United States these days is crooked and corrupt, and those who aren't—like the dogged insurance investigator (Warren Oates) who attempts to catch O'Neal—are ludicrous and out-of-it squares. We all cheat on our income tax, pad our expense accounts, and bilk insurance companies whenever we get the chance, says O'Neal upon giving up his straight job in the opening scenes of the picture and heading off to his apartment to put himself through an at-home crash course in breaking-and-entering, lock-picking, and safe-cracking. O'Neal adds, "Everybody steals from everybody," and so, by extension, it's perfectly okay to break into some rich guy's house and help yourself to his wife's jewels.

In *The Thief Who Came to Dinner*, Yorkin and Hill would have us believe that stealing jewels is a prankish, victimless crime, and so we're supposed to look upon O'Neal as a hero because, as "an honest thief," there is no hypocrisy in what he is doing. And, presumably seduced by O'Neal's boyish charm in contrast with the charmless, middle-aged greed of his fat-cat Houston victims, we're also supposed to root for him as he sets about his second-story jobs. We see O'Neal, in fact, mainly through the eyes of a sexy young Houston socialite (Jacqueline Bisset), who at once falls in love with him upon finding out that he is a jewel thief rather than merely the somewhat shady businessman she'd at first taken him for.

Indeed, as amoral as he is, she is soon cheerfully aiding and abetting him in his crimes, and we're supposed to be charmed by her, too. Traditional morality, in short, is turned upside down in *The Thief Who Came to Dinner*—the thief is the good guy, his victims are the bad guys, and the man trying to catch the thief is a jerk.

The gentleman jewel thief has long been a staple character of popular fiction and movies, of course. In previous films about jewel thieves, however, the thief usually either is a reformed character (Cary Grant in *To Catch a Thief*) or is robbing from the rich in order to give to the poor (*Zorro*, et al.). And even Raffles, of whom the title character in *The Thief Who Came to Dinner* is obviously an updated model, never claimed that what he was up to was morally okay. But the self-righteous young man played by O'Neal, who robs from the rich to keep it all for himself, can see nothing wrong with lifting jewels from the wealthy because they're all thieves, too. Thus the message of the film is clear: because we're all guilty, nobody is guilty, and so there's nothing unethical by present-day standards about being a thief.

If you can ignore its message, *The Thief Who Came to Dinner* is a fairly diverting movie—fast-paced, sometimes funny, slickly written, jazzily filmed in DeLuxe color, and carried along by a pulsating Henry Mancini background score. A minor film, it would not be worth going on about if I didn't feel that it says a lot more about our society

than perhaps even Yorkin and Hill realized when they were making it. Pauline Kael dismisses the moral stance of the film as "the usual modern movie-colony cynicism," but I disagree. In *The Thief Who Came to Dinner* Yorkin and Hill are, I think, reflecting an idea that, far from being restricted to the movie-colonial set, is held by millions of Americans throughout the country, from Malibu Beach to the South Bronx: namely, that almost everyone is indeed corrupt and crooked—the New York police who let millions of dollars of heroin disappear from their custody, the executives of RTT who attempted to buy political favor by underwriting the Republican National Convention, those shadowy figures in the Nixon administration who planned the Watergate break-in, etc., etc. And if President Nixon's personal counsel, John W. Dean, can evidently lie to the FBI about matters involving the Watergate caper, a lot of people are saying these days, why shouldn't the rest of us lie to, say, the Internal Revenue Service? Such thinking leads ultimately to chaos and anarchy, of course, and yet, as each morning's newspaper brings further reports of skulduggery in high places, it's becoming more and more widespread. In consequence, though *The Thief Who Came to Dinner* is based on the shakiest of logic, I suspect that it will do rather well at the box office, especially with the young, among whom the line of reasoning put forward in the film by Yorkin and Hill is particularly popular these days. □
