COMMUNISTS ORDER DRIVE FOR ROOSEVELT ELECTION

MOSCOW REDS COMMAND WORKERS IN U. S. PUSH QUEST FOR THIRD TERM

NEW YORK, N. Y.—Soviet Russia is intensely interested in America's next presidential campaign, for upon the next election hinges a great portion of the worldwide program of the Communist International division.

In Moscow recently, the official newspaper of the International Young Communist League carried a statement commanding Reds in America to work for the re-election of President Roosevelt, if he chooses to make a stab for another four years in the White House. In the event Mr. Roosevelt declines, Communists were ordered to support a candidate who shares his views, particularly his views on toreign policy.

Although President Roosevelt most certainly is no Communist, it is not at all surprising that Moscow Communists are taking such an interest in his re-election. No prominent statesman, willingly or unwillingly, has given more aid to the Communist cause than the President of the United States.

In his attitude toward the so-called Fascist nations, in his support of the Spanish Loyalists, and in his loans to what remains of China, the President has warmed the heart of Josef Stalin.

In fact, harsh as the statement may seem, there is hardly a part of President Roosevelt's program and policy that does not further the Communist plan of world revolution. Mr. Roosevelt's failure to solve America's economic problems has spread such confusion and chaos throughout the country that the Communist Party in the last few years has more than doubled its membership!

Mr. Roosevelt's policy of limiting food production while 12-million Americans border on starvation has bolstered the Communist call for strict government control of agriculture. Mr. Roosevelt's policy of destroying America's foreign trade by capitulating to anti-Fascist and anti-Nazi boycotts sponsored by Jewish interests has helped to create in the cotton districts of the south and the farm districts of the west a wasteland


of economic desplation, wherein Communism spawns.

These things are appreciated deeply by Stalin and his Red hordes of the godless. Appreciation is expressed in their actions and in their literature; in all their thousands upon thousands of Communist papers, pamphlets, magazines, movies, books, stage plays and radio programs which at present are suffocating traditional Americanism.

All Communist propaganda presents glowing tributes to President Roosevelt interspersed between the usual Red cries for war, revolution, atheism.

Slightly more than a month ago Earl Browder, dictator of American Reds and Moscow's representative in the United States, announced that the Communist Party would stand squarely behind President Roosevelt in his third term quest. Thus Mr. Roosevelt, if he runs, may find his name heading the Communist as well as the Democratic ticket.

Most cleverly the Communists have concealed from the eyes of the world the brutal butchery that always accompanies their rise to power. In Red Russia the rotted bodies of more than 20-million martyred Christians testify mutely that Communism is not what it preaches; that Bolshevik sadists have no love for democracy, or that for which it stands.
